Habitat for Humanity Building on Faith

There will be three important ways we may support our local Valdosta/Lowndes County Habitat for Humanity affiliate next month during the annual Building on Faith week. **November 11-18, 2017**, has been set aside for congregations of our community to provide support to build one house in a week. We may help as follows:

- ~ **Pray** for the success of the project and for the Habitat Partner Family that will be working to complete construction of their own new home.
- ~ **Volunteer** to help one or more days during the week. Framing day will be Saturday, November 11. Construction will resume on Tuesday, November 14, and continue through Saturday, November 18. Volunteers may work a half day or a full day. Lunch is provided at the work site. A signup sheet will be posted at Trinity.
- ~ **Give** financially to support the project. Freewill offerings over-and-above one's pledge can be made by check payable to Trinity Presbyterian Church and marked for HFH BOF. Our Missions Committee challenges the congregation to raise \$1,000 or more for this effort.

Trinity's Advent Devotional Tradition

Once again we will be preparing our own “in house” devotional guide book for the season of Advent. Church members and friends of the congregation are encouraged to write a brief devotional to be printed in the daily guide book. Tell a story, share a favorite Christmas memory, or write about what faith in Christ means to you. There is a sign up calendar at church. We have 18 people signed up, **but still need 4 more**. We need your devotionals by **November 12**. Please consider helping with this meaningful Trinity tradition.

We are thankful for the night that Jesus shared a meal with His friends and how He took the bread, blessed, and broke it and gave it to them telling them to "take and eat and do this in remembrance of me." And we are thankful that Jesus took a cup and poured wine into it saying, "this is the cup of my covenant, poured out in my blood for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink of it, remember me." Yes, we are thankful. But did He really have to die? It is hard to be thankful for death. But we are grateful that death is not the end. With the women we stare open-mouthed at the empty tomb.

With confused understanding we are grateful for resurrection.

Lord, send Your Spirit to lift us above our lukewarm thankfulness. Turn our desire to be grateful into true gratitude. Take these simple gifts of bread and wine and use them to transform us. Mold us into people who are truly thankful for Your blessings as we participate in Your very body and blood. With Christ, in Christ, through Christ, in communion with the Creator and the Spirit we are thankful. Amen.

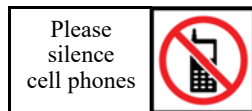
