

**A Message from the Wilderness**

It is hard to believe that I am about to wrap up my time here in Atlanta. My trip to Scotland is already upon me, beginning this Thursday. But the last six weeks have been very meaningful and interesting. I have accomplished much of what I set out to do, and more. In addition to what I have already reported, I have eaten a variety of Middle Eastern and Arabian foods; participated in Friday prayers accompanied by Mr. Ibrahim Awad, who explained a lot of details to me; and had a casual lunch and conversation with Imam Arshad Anwar, whose mosque in Roswell is very active in all aspects of their local community. Arshad is a very personable young man who is likely in his early to mid-thirties. He was born in Karachi, Pakistan, but grew up in Ocean Springs, Mississippi, where he father was a physician for many years. He returned to Karachi for his training to be an imam. He told me of many things their congregation, Roswell Community Masjid, and Roswell Presbyterian Church do together, with the leadership of the pastor of that church, the late Rev. Lane Alderman, whom I knew from associations many years ago.

In addition to meaningful encounters such as these, I have visited with Mike, Rebecca, and William Stoltzfus-Green, and worshiped at their church, Lawrenceville Presbyterian Church. Having spent a Saturday night in their home we were able to catch up on a lot in our shared conversation. I also had a wonderful visit with my long-time friend, the Rev. Barry Ferguson, who lives in Marietta and is a retired Presbyterian pastor. He served churches in Columbus, Georgia, and at one time we worked together on the staff of First Presbyterian Church there.

So I will fly to Glasgow, Scotland this Thursday and spend a little over two weeks in the country. I will visit on the Isle of Iona for five days and then spend time around the western Highlands. Brian, my son, will join me for the last five days. We hope to do some hiking on the Isle of Skye, maybe go snow skiing in the Nevis Mountain Range, and visit Edinburgh.

I miss you all. I miss my normal routines. It will be good to get home for good on Saturday, April 8. I hope to share my experiences and what I have learned with any who are interested in hearing my story. Thank you again for allowing me this most meaningful time away.

Deepen your Lenten Journey in one or more of the following ways this week:

**Through Prayer:** Pray the "Jesus Prayer." In a comfortable position bow your head and attend to your breathing. As you breathe in pray: "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God..." and as you breathe out pray: "have mercy on me a sinner." Repeat this over and over and as you repeat the phrase focus on the meaning of the words, praying them from the heart and in the heart.

**Through Service:** Write a note of thanks for the students who are here this week staying in our building in order to work with Habitat for Humanity.

**Through Fasting:** Turn off the lights. Walk through your house and turn off every light and see how late you can go in the evening before turning them back on.

**Through Prayer:** Pray the Hours. For one or more days set an alarm on your phone or watch to remind you to pray at the top of each hour. When your alarm sounds stop what you are doing and offer up prayer for at least 1 minute.

**Through Service:** Purchase a roll of quarters and visit a local laundromat and offer to pay for folks to wash or dry their clothes.

**Through Fasting:** Give up something from your diet this week... coffee, diet coke, sugar, etc. Pick one item that you feel like you can't live without and give it up for the entire week.

**Prayer Centers in Worship**



**Daily Morning Worship for 40 Days**

Elder Bryan Wright continues to offer a Lenten Observance Discipline every morning for 40 days during Lent. He is leading a 20 minute devotional at 7:00 a.m. in the Sanctuary for any who wish to participate. The forty days of Lent are Monday through Saturday from **Ash Wednesday, March 1**, through the **Saturday before Easter, April 15**. Sundays are not included in Lent. The devotion includes meditative music, reading from the *Presbyterians Today 2017 Lenten Devotional, Meeting Jesus*, and quiet reflection on a theme for the day. Participants may be on their way by 7:20 a.m. each morning.

**Carry-outs – meal cost above plus 25¢ per carry-out tray.**


**Thursday Morning Bible Study**
