



A Message from the Wilderness

I am comfortably settled on the Island of Iona off the west coast of Scotland. (It took not one but two ferry boat rides to reach this place.) I say “comfortable,” at least my room, the common room, and the refectory (dining hall) are comfortable. The weather here is cold, there is a constant sea breeze, which at times is a stiff wind, and the skies are mostly overcast with intermittent rain. But Scotland is beautiful even in the rain.

My room is in the Iona Abbey and Church (pictured here) which was originally built in 1300 AD. It was restored in the 1930s and is home to a full program of spiritual and communal inquiry. It is also a significant destination for people all over the world who come to learn about the roots of Christianity in the British Isles at this living museum. St. Columba came from Ireland to establish a monastery on this island and from here reached out to the people living on the Scottish mainland with the Gospel of Christ. That happened in 563 AD.

I am part of a work crew helping to prepare the facilities here for the full program which begins next week and runs until October. Some are painting, some are deep cleaning all the guest rooms, and four of us are doing yard work. At least those were the jobs today. There will likely be other tasks before the week ends on Thursday.

This is a remarkable place, with a deep history, and a phenomenal spiritual connection. There is a quote on the entrance hall to the Abbey by Dr. Samuel Johnson from 1773 which says, “That one is little to be envied whose piety would not grow warmer amidst the ruins of Iona.” That has been my blessed experience thus far here.



Deepen your Lenten Journey in one or more of the following ways this week:

Through Prayer: Pray the Lord’s Prayer every day at least one time. Each day pick one line to repeat over and over really listening to the petition and what it is saying to you.

Through Service: Seek *Holy Conversation* this week with someone you’ve never had conversation with before. Begin with some simple questions for the other and don’t be afraid to delve deeper into deeper topics. Don’t set an agenda but do agree on how long you will meet (3x for one hour or 1x for 2 hours).

Through Fasting: For one day turn off the water in your home. Don’t use any water from the taps to bathe, cook or drink...the residents of Flint, Michigan have endured more than 1,000 days without clean water and have relied on bottled water for all of their needs during this crisis.

Through Prayer: Find a recording (online or in your library) of the song “Give Me Jesus.” As you listen to the simple words of this spiritual, reflect on what it means to have Jesus every day and in every circumstance of life.

Through Service: Write a note to a public servant. You can write a note calling their attention to a need you see in the world, you can write them a note of thanks, or whatever you choose. Take the time to think about what you might say to a member of Congress, the President, our City leaders or State leaders.

Through Fasting: Go one day without speaking. Grab a pad of paper and pen or dry erase board if you must communicate. Make a name tag that lets folks know that you are taking a vocal rest and will not be speaking for 24 hours. As you give up speech for a day think about how much more you listen when you are not waiting for your turn to speak.

Drs. Les and Cindy Morgan to visit Trinity




