


Back From the Wilderness!

I am pictured here with Dr. Kahlid Sadiq, founding member of Al Farouq, inside the masjid. He is a prominent physician in Atlanta and has been on the faculty of the medical college at Emory University Hospital. He is an active participant in inter-faith projects including membership in Faith Alliance of Metro Atlanta. He welcomed me graciously and spent time sharing with me about his faith and his inter-faith efforts.



Al Farouq Mosque (called a "masjid" in Arabic) is a large and prominent landmark in Mid Town Atlanta. I visited Friday Prayers there during my sojourn in Atlanta.



A "pilgrimage" (in this case about two miles) is more than a hike. It is a walking journey that includes directed thought and conversation, personal contemplation, and conscious recognition of the sights and sounds of creation encountered along the way, like this "highland cow" and his mate.

On a "pilgrimage" across the Isle of Iona, we stopped by the ruins of the "nunnery" which, unlike the Abbey Church, has not been restored. While there, silently contemplating the contribution of women of faith, we were then given a chance to utter aloud the names women of the Bible, women in Church history, and women who had influenced our own lives and faith.

This Lenten season many of you have expressed how much you've enjoyed the Prayer Centers in worship and the hope is that they have deepened your spiritual journey this past 40 days. Many of you took advantage of one or more of the Spiritual Discipline suggestions that were in the newsletter these past few weeks. HOLY WEEK

The final seven days leading to Easter began with Palm Sunday on April 9th. As part of our Sunday Morning Worship, the children and choir processed into worship with palms and singing.

We will have our regular Wednesday Night Supper and activities on April 12th.

Maundy Thursday - we will have worship and Communion at 7:00 p.m. in the Sanctuary.

Good Friday - we will have a special service of remembrance and prayer at 12 noon in the Sanctuary (it will last for 15 minutes, plenty of time to take out of a lunch break).

Holy Saturday - will be the Easter Party for the Children from 10:00 a.m. to 12 noon in the Christian Education wing.

Easter Sunday, April 16th, will begin with the Sunrise Service at 6:55 a.m. followed by the Easter Breakfast in the Fellowship Hall. Our Easter Worship Service with Communion will be at 11:00 a.m. in the Sanctuary. There will be no Sunday School on Easter Sunday.

Remember the morning Lenten Devotionals continue through Saturday, April 15 and the Prayer Centers will include some additions specific to Maundy Thursday and Good Friday.

Easter Sunrise Service and Potluck Breakfast

You don't want to miss the Youth leading our Sunrise service by the outdoor cross. We will begin at **6:55 a.m.** and immediately following the service we will go to the Potluck breakfast in the Fellowship Hall. Everyone is asked to bring a dish to share as well as flowers to help fill our cross.
