

Elder Nominee Biographical Sketches

The Church Officer Nominating Committee (CONC) offers the following church members as nominees for the office of elder to serve on the Session in the class of 2020. By request of the CONC the following biographical sketches are being provided by the nominees for information. The Session has called a Congregational Meeting for Sunday, November 19, 2017, at noon immediately following worship for the purpose of acting on the Committee's recommendation. All of these nominees have agreed to serve if elected by the congregation.

Nominees from the floor will be permitted during the Congregational Meeting. Anyone making such nomination from the floor must have secured the willingness of the nominee to serve if elected.

David Armond was born in West Jefferson, Louisiana in April, 1969. Before he moved to Valdosta he lived in Columbia South Carolina for 17 years where he worked for Direct TV as an installer. He is now on disability because of kidney disease. His father worked for the New Orleans Police Department and his mother worked for the Department of Agriculture. He is the youngest of his mother's five children and the fifth of his father's children, five brothers and two sisters. He was raised in the Roman Catholic Church. David joined Trinity by Reaffirmation of Faith in March 2008. He has served as an usher and is currently an Usher Team Captain. He has also been part of our Wednesday Night Supper Cooking Teams.

David says, "God is my healer, protector, and comforter. He has put people in my path and led them to me at just the right time as to His will and purpose. For that I feel loved and blessed to be called a child of God. My Trinity family has always been available when I needed them, especially through my kidney transplant operation. I feel that God has called me now to give back to Trinity."

Carol A. Hartley-Oliver is her name as it appears on the charter of Trinity Presbyterian Church. She and her husband, Guy, have indeed been charter members since the church's founding in 1985. Guy retired from the Air Force at Moody Air Force Base in 1995. They have lived in Valdosta for quite some time. Before moving to Valdosta, they were stationed in Germany for five years. She retired recently as director of the Literacy Volunteer Program.

Charlie says, "I believe in grace through faith, and that Jesus Christ is the only way to eternal life. I also believe that we should love our neighbors and be merciful to our enemies. As a charter member of Trinity, I have been in a variety of positions - from Sunday school superintendent to choir member as well as being on a variety of church committees. I am an ordained elder as well. If elected, I will listen and will do my best to move Trinity forward as a strong faith-based church."

Bernie Preyna was born in Buffalo, New York. She and her late husband were married for 25 years before his death, and reared two wonderful sons, one of whom is a member and elder at Trinity - Brian, Chief Master Sargent in the Air Force. She says she has "five beautiful grandsons."

She was a cardiology nurse for 32 years before transitioning to medical insurance which she did for 23 years. In both professions she has held numerous positions with upper level responsibilities. Bernie is currently semi-retired, still working to help patients have access to quality services.

Formerly Roman Catholic where her faith was formed and developed, Bernie participated actively with her extended family at Kirkwood Presbyterian Church in Virginia.

She says, "My faith has been brought to a new level since becoming a member at Trinity Presbyterian in 2016, where I have experienced many levels of fellowship, education, committee work, and mission programs. I believe in God, and the action that my faith imparts is who I am and how I choose to live my life. My faith in God is the basis of my morals and values."

Beth Reid was born in Lincoln, Illinois. She has two grown children, Jenn Smith Schneider and Alex Smith. She moved to Valdosta in August 2016 from Panama City, Florida where she was a para-professional at Bay High School. Prior to that she completed a career in the United States Air Force. She moved here with her mother, Marilyn, who is also a member at Trinity. Beth is currently employed as a para-professional in special education at Lowndes High School.

Beth was born a Presbyterian, christened in her grandparents' church, the United Cumberland Presbyterian Church, in which her parents were married, and in which both of her children were christened. She belonged to that church until 2011 when she transferred her membership to Grace Presbyterian Church in Panama City, Florida. While at Grace she worked in the food pantry, vacation Bible school, and as an ordained elder, serving on the Christian Education committee.

Beth says about her faith that, without trying to be flippant, "The Apostles' Creed gets to the crux of my beliefs way better than I ever could."

Grant Wright was born in Grand Rapids, Michigan where he lived until 1978. He and Janet were married in 1972, and they moved to Lowell, Michigan where they lived until moving to Valdosta in June 2016. He has a daughter, Melissa, also a member at Trinity, and two grandchildren, Austin and Mickeala.

His career in the auto service industry started in 1969, from which he retired after 45 years. He started out washing cars, then worked his way up to fixed operations manager. Continued education in the industry was provided by Chrysler Corporation with 4000+ hours technical, parts, and management training over the course of his career.

He attended Community of Christ Church from birth until moving to Valdosta. He was baptized in 1959 and ordained to the office of Priest in October, 2009. He has served the church on the pastoral support team and as Pastor.

Grant says of his faith, "God has always been important in my life. The wonder of creation never gets old. Every time I study the Bible I discover something new. God has continued to lead me forward, and that continues and becomes more apparent every day. That includes coming to Trinity, becoming a member, and being nominated as elder on the session."

Stewardship Season Continues



**Carry-outs – meal cost above plus 25¢ per carry-out tray.**



**Thursday Morning Bible Study**
